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




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# 1. Increasing attainment levels

- Reaching out to broader sections of society;
- Developing clear progression routes from vocational and other education types into higher education;
- Reducing drop-out rates;
- Training more researchers.



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## 2. Improving the quality of higher education and its relevance to the needs of society and the economy

- Attuning curricula to current and emerging labour market needs;
- Developing flexible and innovative learning approaches and methods of delivering education;
- Improving the competence and motivation of teachers and researchers;
- Aligning researcher training with the needs of the knowledge-intensive labour market and in particular with the requirements of SMEs.



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### **3. Strengthening quality through international mobility of students, researchers and staff , internationalization of higher education and cross-border co-operation**

- Eliminating unnecessary barriers to switching institutions between bachelor and master levels;
- Ensuring efficient recognition of credits gained abroad;
- Attracting the best students, academics and researchers from outside the EU.



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## 4. Strengthening the knowledge triangle between education, research and business

- Stimulating the development of entrepreneurial, creative and innovation skills and promoting innovation in higher education;
- Strengthening the knowledge-transfer infrastructure of HEIs;
- Making cooperation with business a core activity of HEIs;
- Turning HEIs into centres of knowledge and expertise engaged with regional economic development.



## 5. Creating effective governance and funding mechanisms in support of excellence

- Better targeting of public spending by linking funding mechanisms to performance and to different institutional profiles;
- Diversifying sources of funding of HEIs;
- Making funding and governance systems more flexible; relaxing legal financial and administrative restrictions;
- Investing in professional management of HEIs;
